

SINGLE COURSE EXAM AND GRADE INCREASING EXAM

In order to take both exams, the student must be a graduate. Students who are eligible to graduate as a result of the exam can apply via MyKHAS on the dates specified in the academic calendar.

What is a Single Course Exam? Who Can Apply and How?

- It is the exam taken by students who have completed all their obligations, including internship, and could not graduate because they failed only one course.
- The grade he received from the course in which he will take the single course exam and his GPA must be over 2.00.
- The grade received as a result of a single course exam is entered into the system with the description TD (Single Course) and appears in the transcript with the description TD.

What is the Grade Increasing Exam? Who Can Apply and How?

- It is an exam in which students who are successful in all courses but cannot meet the graduation requirements due to their GPA being below 2.00 can take a course they choose among their conditionally successful courses in order to raise their GPA above 2.00.
- The grade he received from the course in which he took the Grade Increasing exam is entered into the system with the NY (Grade Increasing) explanation and appears on the transcript with the NY explanation.

Students who fail a single course exam or cannot graduate at the end of the grade increasing exam can take the exam again in subsequent semesters or at the end of summer education, or retake the course in the semester it is offered, provided that they pay the determined fee.

It is not possible to take both a single course and a grade increasing exam in the same semester.

If the undergraduate program has a compulsory internship, the student cannot take a single course or grade increasing exam if the internship is incomplete.
