GENERAL INFORMATION

Students may apply to a second major degree program at the earliest in the third semester and at the latest at the beginning of the fifth semester of their primary major program, on the dates specified in the academic calendar. In order to be eligible to apply for a double major program, students must have successfully completed all the courses they have taken in their primary major program up to the semester in which they are applying. Candidates applying to the special talent programs of Kadir Has University must take and pass the special talent exams conducted by the respective programs. A student cannot be enrolled in more than one second major degree program at the same time. However, it is possible to be enrolled in both a second major degree program and a minor program simultaneously.

At the time of application, students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.72/4.00 in their primary major program and must rank within the top 20% of their class in terms of academic performance. Students whose cumulative GPA in the primary major is at least 2.72/4.00 but who are not in the top 20% of their class may still apply to a double major program, provided that their centralized placement score is not lower than the base score of the intended second major program for that academic year. In programs that require a success ranking—such as Law, Engineering, and Architecture—students who wish to pursue a double major must also meet the success ranking requirement determined by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK) for the year in which they were admitted, in addition to the other conditions specified in this regulation. Theater students who were admitted through a special talent exam must have a placement score that is at least equal to the base score of the intended second major program

Throughout the duration of the double major program, a student's cumulative GPA may drop to as low as 65 out of 100 (2.50/4.00) only once. If the GPA falls below 65 (2.50/4.00) a second time, the student will be dismissed from the second major degree program. If a student does not take any courses from the double major program for two consecutive semesters, their registration in the second major degree program will be terminated. For students who are dismissed from or voluntarily leave the double major program, the courses they have successfully completed in the second major may be counted as elective courses in their primary major program, subject to the recommendation of their academic advisor and the decision of the relevant faculty board. If these students have not yet fulfilled the graduation requirements of their primary major and meet the application requirements for a minor program, they may choose to enroll in a minor program with the approval of the relevant faculty board.
